Livestock, particularly cows, along route. It is very important that walkers, with dogs, familiarise themselves with the action to be taken if approached / attacked by cattle. From the free car park, adjoining Skenfrith Castle, we walk alongside the river Monnow for about 1 mile before beginning the climb out of the river valley towards the hamlet of Broad Oak. By this stage of our walk, we will have crossed the border into England. The ascent out of this valley is mainly gradual, but with a short, steeper section at the start. We will have a coffee break at some point along this part of the route. We continue our walk across undulating farmland and through the village of Garway, to our lunch stop in the grounds of St Michael's Templar church. Once we reach the top the views open out in all directions we are now in land of fields, narrow lanes and dry stone walls. We take the lanes and we make a gradual ascent towards Abercynon. Just above Abercynon Its then a steeper ascent through woodland to the Abercnon cemetery. Still heading down we pick up the (virtually flat) Cynon trail which takes alongside the river Cynon through copses and woodland back to Mountain Ash. The first mile of this walk is all uphill and we will stop frequently, there is a lot of walking on tarmac and when we leave the tarmac the paths are quite good. The walk will take us across the A465, it is a clear stretch of road and we will be able to cross easily. We will take the narrow road passed Llanvihangel Court which we will view on our return, it is a very old manor house which is still occupied today. We are walking through the beautiful county of Monmouthshire through fields and pasture land, there is a slight incline on the first part of the walk up to a lane which runs under the Skirrid. You will be pleased to know we will not be climbing on this occasion. The walk takes us down through fields and a wooded area which has a stream and two pretty bridges. We are in the heart of the Black Mountains and the views are really lovely. It is very important that all dogs are kept on a lead through out the walk it is lambing season and there are sheep and lambs out in the fields. The walk is clearly marked in the usual way there are only two stiles, the rest have been replaced by gates. The walk is muddy in places and it would be advisable to wear garters or protective over trousers. When we return to the village a visit to the oldest pub in Wales the Skirrid which is supposed to be haunted is recommended.
